hearing as well as all other major decision making stages a unique feature is its in depth coverage of plea bargaining also featured are topics such as parental role in the juvenile justice system school searches and the origin of juvenile court several chapters detailing how many youths have been affected by various decisions made in the juvenile justice system such as arrest detention transfer to adult court adjudication being placed on probation or committed to residential placement in addition the appendices identify juvenile justice standards for all 50 states and washington dc as well as the federal jurisdiction these standards apply to all decisions made within the juvenile justice system including arrest detention diversion intake transfer adjudication disposition and postdispositional stages the text is written in a conversational reader friendly style each chapter describes and analyzes step by step what young alleged offenders experience in each successive stage of the court process for each chapter outlines of key terms and concepts aid student comprehension and serve as a starting point for class discussion each chapter also features discussion questions designed to stimulate students critical thinking a comprehensive instructor s manual testing program is available of the book
