as helpless victims this book also recognizes positive outcomes moments of resistance friendship and inner strength taking the lead from the youth the authors make recommendations for challenging homophobic and transphobic bullying in high schools and for supporting students who experience this form of harassment in this engaging and enlightening book youth share their feelings of rage and hurt joy and triumph as they reminisce about the experience of being queer in high school book jacket

this book records real life experiences of transgender violence and victimisation analysing the legal lacunae in granting protection to the historically vulnerable community and their perspective of the law and safety it is an outcome of extensive empirical legal research conducted in the state of west bengal india with exploration of global scenario of violence a systematic pattern of victimisation has been identified leading to a reasonable conclusion of internationalisation of transgender violence and victimisation that is largely ignored and is bereft of any legal protection premised on the fact that without safety and protection against grave crimes no amount of civil rights protection is effective the book provides an account of the ever increasing gravity of transgender violence and victimisation recognising that there is a paucity of research on type of targeted violence against transgender persons yet even with that scarcity of consistent and reliable reporting to official law enforcement sources the data that is available from governments public interest groups and community surveys about sozi motivated violence reveals that precarity prevalence violence and the harm caused are graver as against other types of crimes and crimes against lgb population the author deliberately chose to focus on

bisexual rights but we are still failing this test in respect of trans people despite welcome progress high levels of transphobia are experienced by individuals on a daily basis including in the provision of public services with serious results about half of young trans people and a third of trans adults attempt suicide the recent deaths in custody of two trans women and the case of a trans woman who was placed in a men s prison are particularly stark illustrations of the issues the gender recognition act 2004 was pioneering but is now dated its medicalised approach pathologises trans identities and runs contrary to the dignity and personal autonomy of applicants the government must update the act in line with the principle of gender self declaration trans people feel strongly that the provision on spousal consent under the marriage same sex couples act 2013 gives spouses an effective veto on gender recognition however marriage is a legal contract between two consenting parties the terms of which cannot be changed without the consent of both we do though take very seriously the possibility that this provision may be used by spouses with malicious intent protection for trans people under the equality act 2010 was a huge step forward however the terms gender reassignment and transsexual in the act are outdated and misleading and may not cover wider members of the trans com the protected characteristic should be amended to that of gender identity
