

Principles Of Biomedical Ethics

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for many years this has been a leading textbook of bioethics it established the framework of principles within the field this is a very thorough revision with a new chapter on methods and moral justification

biomedical ethics was a young field when the first edition of this book went to press in late 1977 immense changes occurred in the field s literature between the first edition and the present fourth edition although major changes have appeared in all editions after the first this edition includes more significant changes than any other

this edition represents a thorough going revision of what has become a classic text in biomedical ethics major structural changes mark the revision the authors have added a new concluding chapter on methods that along with its companion chapter on moral theory emphasizes convergence across theories coherence in moral justification and the common morality they have simplified the opening chapter on moral norms which introduces the framework of prima facie moral principles and ways to specify and balance them together with the shift of advanced material on theory to the back of the book this heavily revised introductory chapter will make it easier for the wide range of students entering bioethics courses to use this text another important change is the increased emphasis on character and moral agency drawing the distinction between agents and actions the sections on truth telling disclosure of bad news privacy conflicts of interest and research on human subjects have also been thoroughly reworked the four core chapters on principles respect for autonomy nonmaleficence beneficence and justice and the chapter on professional patient relationships retain their familiar structure but the authors have completely updated their content to reflect developments in philosophical analysis as well as in research medicine and health care throughout they have used a number of actual cases to illuminate and to test their theory method and framework of principles

this brief summary of the issues of biomedical ethics provides a balanced systematic unbiased framework designed to help health professionals an lay people understand and analyze a wide range of topics that are currently controversial in

medicine or that are likely to arise in the future broad in scope it considers ethical systems from various religious and secular traditions including those of non western cultures such as asian religious and secular traditions topics include the history of codes of ethics the definition of death abortion animal rights and welfare problems in deciding what will benefit patients confidentiality truth telling informed consent the care of the terminally ill genetics birth technologies and problems of social ethics including resource allocation organ transplant and human subjects research for use in allied health fields

this title was first published in 2002 this volume discusses the subject of biomedical ethics various views historical and contemporary are discussed with the editors using the contrasting concepts in the shift from paternalism to autonomy in 20th century medicine as a heuristic tool for the critical study of ethics in medicine as far as the evidence in this volume goes paternalistic medical practices and patient autonomy had an uneasy relationship by the beginning of the 20th century a hundred years later full autonomy in decisions on medical treatment is still subject to numerous caveats the text pays close attention to the interplay between various players noting how factors such as social contexts governmental organizations and the biotechnological industry influence and shape responses to the principle of bioethics

drawing from clinical experience philosophy psychology and current health law and policy biomedical ethics and decision making is a detailed survey of persistent

issues in health care ethics emphasizing the complexities and nuances of practical decision making and yielding a multifaceted and systematic approach to solving problems as a useful resource for both students and clinicians it includes references for further exploration of ethical issues as well as provocative questions for discussion in classroom and clinical settings as a textbook it stands alongside such standard works as Beauchamp's and Childress's *Principles of Biomedical Ethics*, Degrazia's *Mapping*, and Ballard's *Biomedical Ethics*. Munson's *Intervention and Reflection* and Vaughn's *Bioethics* besides presenting current dilemmas in health care it reviews elements of cognitive psychology describes common errors in critical thinking offers techniques for evaluating and integrating evidence into ethical reasoning assesses professionalism invites readers to dissect philosophical analyses to bolster their critical thinking skills and provides opportunities to engage in self reflection on contemporary challenges in health care policy and delivery

by analyzing the amalgam of greek philosophy jewish and christian teachings and secular humanism that composes our dominant ethical system the authors of this volume explore the question of whether or not western and non western moral values can be commingled without bilateral loss of cultural integrity they take as their philosophical point of departure the observation that both ethical relativism and ethical absolutism have become morally indefensible in the context of the multicultural american life and they variously consider the need for an ethical middle ground

a collection of recent essays by one of the leading names in bioethics baruch brody discusses four major areas of bioethics methodology research ethics clinical ethics and jewish medical ethics and takes issue with conventional bioethical wisdom to carve out his own niche in the field a niche that reflects orthodox judaism intuitionism casuistry case based decision making and a strong recognition of pluralism his positions on animal research brain death and clinical trials are controversial and firmly held leading brody to be one of the most widely discussed bioethicists of his generation

each chapter focuses on a single area in a simple narrative illustrative case reports and case studies of ethical dilemmas are provided with points for reflection discussion in step with the curriculum in medical ethics already established in several medical colleges the chapters can be used to develop modules in a medical

ethics program additional resources titles of relevant films readings and references are provided the chapters have been linked to the aetcom modules for easy reference providing content for teaching modules this book provides the resource to create teaching modules in medical ethics in this way the book compliments the aetcom modules and can be used to develop teaching learning sessions
